### **Benefits of CanPowerSkate**

CanPowerSkate is an action-packed, high energy instructional power skating program geared to hockey and ringette skaters that focuses on balance, power, agility, speed and endurance.

Skills, techniques and conditioning drills are taught in a progressive format that emphasizes how the skills apply to game situations. CanPowerSkate provides an alternative to figure skating and is an excellent complement for those athletes playing on hockey or ringette teams.

Its unique skill award program provides incentives and motivation for skaters to continue to achieve. The coach to skater ratio is 1:10.

# **Eligibility Requirements**

CanPowerSkate is geared to skaters aged approximately six years or older who already have basic skating skills. The program is taught in a group environment, so skaters should have the ability to follow the direction of the coaches with minimal intervention.

- ⇒ Skater must be able to get up on their own.
- ⇒ Skater must be able to skate forward and backward the length of the ice using alternate strides.
- ⇒ Skater must be able to stop without the use of the boards.

Skaters who cannot perform these skills on their own are recommended to join the CanSkate: Learn to Skate program. Please contact Skate Humboldt to find out more about this program, which provides young skaters a solid foundation for any type of skating – hockey, ringette, speed, figure, and recreational.

Hockey and ringette players in the CanPowerSkate program must wear full hockey equipment that is CSA approved. There will be a range of recreational, hockey, ringette, and experienced skaters involved in the program.

The CanPowerSkate program is available only to Skate Canada member clubs and sanctioned skating schools. All participants will be registered with Skate Canada.

**IMPORTANT** The CanPowerSkate program begins <u>before</u> city-wide registration and is extremely popular. Applications will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. Register early to avoid disappointment!
